The long term solution of how children may live safely surrounded by the poisons of the garden and those found inside the home lies in the education of adults to these dangers.

In the final analysis, it is up to parents to impress upon their children that they must never eat or even taste the leaves, berries, or fruits found in neighborhood yards, in parks, or in a wild state in the deserts and Furthermore, adult leaders

who teach groups of children in fundamentals of survival without a regular food supply would do well to reconsider this type of education in the light of its inherent dangers. Legislation concerning poison-

ous flora can never take the place of good parental supervision in the latter of preventing poisoning among children.

Research Grant For Muscular Dystrophy Made
