

Real Estate To Be Taught

Reflecting the increasing demand for professional real estate training in the South Bay area, University of California Extension will offer two real estate courses at Redondo Union high school, starting February 11 and 13.

Presented in cooperation with the South Bay Board of Realtors, both courses may be taken as part of the curriculum for the Real Estate Certificate Program, consisting of a total of eight courses.

The course in Real Estate Practices will survey the techniques used in the real estate business, with special emphasis on securing and qualifying prospects, listings, selling, legal factors, financing, advertising, and escrows. The class will be given Tuesday evenings, from 7 to 9:30 p.m., starting February 11. Joseph Chase, realtor, will serve as instructor.

The problems of property investment and management, especially as pertaining to Ocean Beach properties, will be analyzed in the course in property management, meeting Thursday evenings from 7 to 9:30 p.m., starting February 13. The instructor will be Whylie Somers, bank property manager and appraiser.

Both courses will meet in room 311 of the school, located at Diamond and Pacific Coast highway in Redondo Beach. Registration is being accepted at the University of California Extension Center, 813 South Hill street, Los Angeles 14 (TUcker 6123), or through the first week of classes, space per-
