

To Make Pink Peppermint Whipped Cream Hearts. Add few drops peppermint extract and few drops red food coloring to sweetened whipped cream. To make heart designs, make outlines on top of filling with a cooky cutter. Then fill in the heart shapes with whipped cream, spreading with spatula.
