## Safety Test For Bicycle Riders

The Crenshaw Safety Committee (CSC) will entertain the students and faculty with a series of activities. This program is under the guidance of Donna Bayliff, president of CSC and vice-president of the student advisory council, and Frank Demyan, faculty ad-

On February 13 and 14 in the school auditorium a written examination on bicycle safety was given all bicycle riders. It consisted of twenty-five questions on bicycle safety and care. This will be under the direction of Barry Levy, vice-president of CSC, and Roger Morgan, member of the committee.

Bicycle condition, brake and signal tests, and courtesy, will be judged by Carol Augsburger, secretary; Adriene Barnett, treasurer; Cheri Rickabaugh, Rickabaugh, Carol Scoville, and Rocky Zar. Drivers licenses will be presented to those who pass the tests.

All entries will be graded, with the sixteen highest scores being able to participate in the rodeo, which is scheduled for March 28. ertificates of merit will be awarded these boys and


