## Hahn Suggests Study Of Salt Water Conversion

Passage of Senate Joint Resolution 135, introduced by Senator Clinton P. Anderson, could clear the way for solving Southern California's water shortage cheaper and faster than the Feather River Project, which will not be completed until 1978 and will cost \$2,000,000,000 to construct, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn declared today.

He pointed out that the resolution calls for an appropriation of \$10 million for construction of a prototype salt water conversion plant.

ACUTE PROBLEM "If the appropriation is approved, the converter plant should be located in Los Angeles County to assist with our water problem, which is becoming more acute each day," Supervisor Hahn stated.

The Federal Government has constructed a number of projects to provide power and water, such as Boulder Dam, Grand Coulee Dam, and the TVA and the people of Southern California should have the same consideration he stated.

A plant to distill 5 million gallons of fresh water daily from sea water could be built for the proposed \$10 million ap-

Cost of converting this amount of fresh water would depend upon the type of fuel used. By combining the water distillation plant with a steam electric plant, the same fuel can be used to produce both electricity and fresh water.

Supervisor Hahn said that the possible use of nuclear power to operate the plant to produce electricity and fresh water should be thoroughly investi-

RUBBISH AS FUEL considered is the huge amount of conbustible rubbish-14,000 tons-collected daily in Los Angeles County, Supervisor Hahn

"Use of this rubbish as fuel would solve the problem of disposing of it and would save the taxpayers millions of dollars by making it unnecessary to buy expensive dump sites," he con-

Supervisor Hahn also urged stepped-up research into the possibility of reclaiming 400 million gallons of treated sewage water which is dumped into the ocean each day through the Hyperian sewage treatment plant and the White Point plant of the county sanitation district.

This reclaimed water could be used in replenishing the underground basins and in placing a barrier against the intrusion of areas, he stated.

### Airport Gets \$1,676,674 For Expansion

Los Angeles International Airport is the recipient of a grant totaling \$1,676,674 from the United States Government, representing Federal government share in land acquisition and preparation of sites for apron and connecting stub taxiways in the new airport expansion plan.

These airfield improvements are in connection with construction of the new, de-centralized passenger terminal area which includes some 13 buildings of major proportions.

Granted by the government through Civil Aeronautics Administration \$334,084 of the sum is reimbursement for land acquisition and the balance, \$1,342,-590 is for runway, taxiway and other airfield facility improvement. Funds become available as construction progresses.
