## Let Us Face the Facts:

All Americans respect J. EDGAR HOOVER, Director, Federal Bureau of Investigation. He is keenly interested in our major problem "JUVEN-ILE DELIQUENCY" so we now publish from Mr. Hoover the following:

"In community after community across the land, the forces of immorality have gained a strangle hold. Filth and degradation may be purchased. Those few twisted minds which still remain in the motion picture and entertainment industry continue to undo the good work of others by placing a premium on indecency.

Is it any wonder then that some young Americans, the children who will inherit the tremendous responsibility of guiding this free Nation, have exhibited so many danger signs? In a country whose principles based upon the teachings of God, children must not be permitted to believe that "anything is all right as long as you can get away with it.'

In 1956, America experienced the worst year of crime in its history. There was a major crime committed every 12.3 seconds.

These figures, alone, are shocking; but even more alarming is the role of youth. Reports from cities across the Nation show that persons under the age of 18 accounted for over 45 per cent of arrests in 1956 for major crimes. Since 1952 our juvenile arrests have risen forty one and one-half per cent.

There is only one inescapable conclusion: Adult America is tragically failing its youth. Where is the influence of the home, Where are the forces for good? The constant deterioration of respect for authority has had an unmistakable and happy influence upon the attitudes of youth.

Are we to stand idly by while fierce young hoodlums-too often

are long harbored under the glossy misnomer of juvenile deliquentsroam our streets and desecrate our communities?

We speak of the church and God's influence upon our people. But in how many homes can the influence of religion truly be found? How many of todays juvenile terrorists are products of unforunate homes where parents have neither the interest nor the desire to become an intregal part of their children's lives. Tragically, the moral decline which is evidenced in our rapidly increasing rates of crime and delinquency can be traced to the very portals of the home.

Moral delinquency is so debauching, spiritual illiteracy is so appalling and secularism is so blighting the unless God abide in the timate atmosphere of the family circle, the best efforts of the church and others whose wholesome elements in the community may be inadequate to correct the damage already done.

The basic cause of the present situation is that so many people have no real sense of moral responsibility which comes from an intimate knowledge of God's teachings. This is essential to meet the communist enemy of both our spiritual and physical freedom.'
