Top ECC Post Filled by April 1

Now in the process of screening some 35 candidates for the post of president, the El Camino College Board of Trustees anticipates the announcement of the successful candidate by April 1.

This was the statement released today by Forrest G. Murdock, retiring president and superintendent of the El Camino Junior College District, who will continue to hold the position until August 1.

Interviews Slated
"Applicants from all parts of the nation have expressed an interest in the post," President Murdock said. "The record of each will be considered in the post," President Murdock said. "The record of each will be considered carefully by the college board before any interviews with the top five or six candidates are scheduled," he continued.

Applications from interested administrators are still being submitted to President Murdock, who also serves in the capacity of secretary to the Board of Trustees. Elected members of the Board are Seymour Rayor, Inglewood, president; Foster A. Day, Redondo Beach, vice president; Dr. Wallace Fraser, Hawthorne, secretary; Hilar C. Ashley, El Segundo, and Jack N. Dabbs, Torrance, members.

Local Men
While the majority of the applications have come from sources outside the local district, a number of applicants have come from current members of the college staff. President Murdock would not comment upon the question of whether the new appointment would be made from within or outside of the college.

El Camino, located on the 90 acre campus on Crenshaw Blvd. between Manhattan Beach and Redondo Beach blvds., is now in its eleventh year with a present enrollment of over 9500.

Only Superintendent
President Murdock is the only man to hold the superintendent's position; he, along with members of the original college staff, was instrumental in surveying the area to determine the need and prospective growth of a community college.

From an original staff of 30, the college faculty and administrative staff has grown to number over 200.

Under President Murdock's guidance, the college has been developed on a unique "pay-as-you-go" plan for capital outlay. No bond issue has ever been requested by the college board, all existing buildings being debt-free.

Of the three directors originally serving in key administrative posts with President Murdock, only one, Carl G. Arfwedson, director of business, remains in his original position. Arfwedson is not a candidate for the president's office, President Murdock indicated.
