### VFW Members to Join Crusade for Cleanup

More than 10,000 veterans, members of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, join the Los Angeles Beautiful Clean Community Crusade next week with a county-wide drive to sell householders an approved type of trash container.

Commander Don Switzer of the V.F.W. Los Angeles County Council declared "Operation Clean-Up" by the veterans will have two purposes. First, the veterans will encourage householders to put their trash in a closed metal container rather than in makeshift boxes which invite vermin and spill litter on streets and parkways.

Second, V.F.W. Posts participating in the house-to-house drive will raise funds for rehabilitation of disabled veterans and other charitable purposes. All of the profits from the sale will be so used, Switzer said.

Members belong to both a local geographical district and the statewide organization. Local meetings, training sessions, and workshops are held by district organizations. The monthly magazine Recreation News Previews is distributed statewide. Activities of the society are guided by a 20-member board of directors and the society is also an affiliate chapter of the American Recreation Society.

Founded in 1945, the society has grown with the field of professional recreation leadership in California in intervening years. It is a co-sponsor with the California Recreation Commission, and the National Recreation Association of the annual California and Pacific Southwest Recreation Conference. The 10th annual such conference was held last week at Fresno.
