Top Staff Change Eyed by City School Board

Plans to reshuffle top level administration in the Torrance Unified School District, were submitted for study to the Board of Education this week.

Need to study reorganization was pointed up by Dr. Albert N. Posner, assistant superintendent of educational services, in a letter to Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent.

Presently Posner is responsible for three divisions, special services, personnel service and instruction.

"The rapid growth of the district presents a need to consider alternate plans of organization as a means of insuring good communications and providing better services," Dr. Posner reported.

He said that when the present organization structure, was adopted in 1954, there was a district enrollment of 12,200. The number of students has swelled to a present enrollment of 21,400, a 43 per cent increase.

Dr. Posner pointed out that the professional staff has also increased, making communication between staff members more complex.

Two plans were submitted for study. One calls for formation of a new division to take charge of personnel service only, and the other would create a new division to take care of both special and personnel services.

Knight, Governor of California, do hereby proclaim March, 1958, as REGISTRATION MONTH in California, and urge all eligible citizens to qualify themselves to participate in this year's elections."
