The partially developed parks are Adult Center in central Torrance, \$16,000; Torrance Park, in central Torrance, \$52,-300; El Retiro Park in the Hollywood Riviera area, \$60,000; Mc-Master Park in North Torrance, \$60,200; Sea-Aire Park in the Seaside area, \$28,000; and Walteria Park in South Torrance, \$51,300.

Allowance is also made for architectural and engineering fees including 71/2% contingency. Van Bellehem stated that the \$2 million would be spent acquiring ten new neighborhood park sites and three major park sites, one each in the northern, central, and southern sections of the city. These are as follows: 166th st. and Arlington, 6 acres; 178th and Western, 10 acres; 190th and Crenshaw, 25 acres; 186th and Prairie, 5 acres; Civic Center, 15 acres; Victor Precinct, 5 acres; Border and laza del Amo, 5 acres; 231st and Arlington, 6 acres; South end of Madison st, 13 acres; Major park in South Torrance, 25 acres; 3 neighborhood parks of about 5 acres each, 15 acres. The Park and Recreation Com-

mission will consider the loca-tion of the three 5-acre neighborhood parks to be included in the bond issue at their meeting on Wednesday, March 26th. Mrs. Bisou summed up the meeting by congratulating her Citizens' Committee that worked to obtain the necessary 2,200 signatures to put the park bond before the people again. Those working on the committee were: Mildred Jurco, Frances Fischer, G. W. Wade, Fred Hoebel, Margie Hughes, Mary K. Christians, Tom Potts, Vickie Feldon.
