The "girls" will adore this novel 1/2 cup grated American or food combination and the men sharp cheese will relish the wonderful chicken-mushroom flavor. You make


METHOD: Grease four 10 oz. individual baking dishes. Place 1/2 cup cooked rice in each baking dish. Divide the pimiento between the four baking dishes. Halve the asparagus spears and divide between baking dishes Top with the chicken. Mix together the milk, mushroom soup, salt and black pepper. Pour over the chicken. Divide the cheese between the baking dishes, sprinkling it over the soup. Cover and store in the refrigerator. At meal time, allow dishes to come to room temperature before placing in a 375° F. oven. Bake about 30 minutes or until the top melts and begins to brown. This recipe makes 4 generous
