Sweet But Slimming Dessert Treat

How often have you heard your friends announce that they're about to go on a diet? Note those words "about to". If you're one of these procrastinators who continually puts off dieting until "tomorrow", here's something to encourage you to get going. It's a low-calorie dessert that tastes like a million.

Named Coffee Ribbon Mold, this dreamy dessert boasts of just 63 calories per serving. That is, IF you make it with the non-caloric sweetener, Sucaryl, rather than with sugar. If you made this same dessert with sugar, calories would jump to considerably more than twice that count. When you turn this unusual coffee-flavored confection out of its

mold, you'll find that three distinct layers or ribbons have formed. On the bottom is a coffee custard, in the middle a coffee jelly and on top a coffee sponge or souffle. Looks lovely, tastes even better!

And if you like whipped cream, try this low-calorie version: Combine ¼ cup nonfat dry milk solids. ¼ cup ice water and ½ teaspoon Sucaryl solution or 4 tablets, crushed. Beat on high speed of mixer until of consistency of whipped cream. Just 7 calories per table-Coffee Ribbon Mold

3 envelopes plain gelatin 1/4 cup cold water 2 cups hot skim milk 1/a teaspoon salt

2 cups strong coffee 2 tablespoons Sucaryl solution 11/4 teaspoons vanilla 3 eggs, separated

Soften gelatin in cold water. Add hot milk slowly to egg yolks top of double boiler; add salt and coffee and cook for 5 minutes. Remove from heat and stir in gelatin until dissolved. Let cool slightly. Meanwhile beat egg whites until foamy; add Sucaryl and beat until stiff peaks form when beater is raised; then add vanilla. Fold into custard mixture and pour into a 6-cup mold. Chill until

Makes 8 servings. Each serving contains 63 CALORIES; 7.6 grams protein; 2.1 grams fat; 3.2 grams carbohydrates. If made with sugar, each serving would contain 135 CALORIES.
