

Capturing all the romance of a colorful travel folder, Kyoto's, the Japanese restaurant on Western, continues to please more patrons, new and old, with its charming atmosphere and delightful dinners.

It's always a special treat to dine in one of the private tatami rooms (without shoes) and be served by the traditionally costumed waitresses. In fact, with the popular Sukiyaki dinners, the main course is prepared right at the table.

The dinner starts with a delicately flavored clear soup (Suumono) served without a spoon, and a very tasty salad (Sunomono). The appetite-whetting salad usually consists of cucumber, turnip, and crab meat. The Sukiyaki, which is prepared at the table in a large metal vessel is made of either tender slices of beef or chicken with Tofu (bean cake), and is flavored with bamboo shoots, mushrooms, onions, and other fragrant and tasty ingredients. While this is cooking, giant sized fried shrimp (Tempura) are served with a delightful sauce.

As an accent to this meal, besides the beverage of green tea, a rice wine (Sake) served warm in a porcelain container, may be ordered. This serves to warm the spirits. Tasty baby orange sections in a gelatin mold top off this enjoyable different dining experience.

In his letter the voter should make the following statements: (1) That he is a voter of Los Angeles County. (2) That he is registered at his home address in the county, the address to be given. (3) That he needs an

absentee ballot for one of three reasons only: absence from election precinct on June 3, physical disability, or religious tenets which prevent his attending the polls throughout June 3. (4) Address where absentee ballot should be mailed. (5) Date. (6) Signature of applicant.
