128 NHS Students Take Scholarship Preliminary Test

Testing their academic achievements, 128 North High School students took the National Merit Scholarship qualifying tests during a three-hour examination April 29.

An estimated \$5,000,000 in scholarship awards are at stake in the national competition now in its fourth year. The awards are sponsored by some 80 corporations, foundations, professional societies and individuals.

Emphasis in the tests is on educational growth and broad intellectual skills, on understanding and ability to use what has been learned, rather than on sheer knowledge of facts.
