

After extraction of the natural teeth, it is normal for the gums to shrink. This shrinkage con tinues to some extent throughout life. Since your dentist made your plate to fit the contours of your gums at a given time, when tissue shrinkage occurs, your plate may start to loosen. When this happens, return to your dentist for re-adaptation of your plate as he thinks best.
