

Coleman Board Declares Dividend

At a board meeting Friday the directors of Coleman Engineering Company of Torrance declared a quarterly dividend of 15 cents per share on the company's common stock, payable July 1 to stock of record June 16. In the same meeting the regular quarterly dividend of 18 3/4 cents per share was declared on the company's 6 per cent convertible preferred stock, payable June 16 to stock of record June 5.

T. C. Coleman, president, estimated that sales combined with those of its subsidiary, Beattley-Coleman, Inc., will be reported for the fiscal year just ended, April 30, in an amount exceeding \$5,500,000. This represents an increase of more than one million dollars above the previous fiscal year.
