New Trade School Uses Realistic Job Techniques

A new trade school which uses "on the job" training techniques for prospective grocery checkers, is now open at 16611 Hawthorne Blvd., Lawndale.
 The South Bay Trade School utilizes a curriculum approved by the Retail Clerks Union and the California Grocersmen's Association in training its students.
 Before a student is accepted, he must undergo a rigid aptitude test, training and a comprehensive final examination.
 The final includes checking 600 items per hour, including at least 50 produce items that must be weighed, and 20 customers.
 The school, which is an expanded unit of the noted Compton Tech School in Compton, also teaches such important lessons as "How to get a job and keep it," proper poise, how to spot counterfeit money and shoplifters.
 School facilities include actual model check stands with National Cash Register touch system.
 The school officials point out that market checkers earn between \$100 and \$130 a week with fringe benefits.
 Enrollment for courses which take 60 hours minimum, is now accepted.

Contract for Jail Requested

Redondo Beach, which has been housing its prisoners in the Torrance City Jail since its own was condemned as unsafe, will be asked to sign a written agreement.
 Cost of pre-trial prisoners to be housed in Torrance will be charged to Redondo under a set of fees, setting prices for meals, booking, pictures and telephone calls.
 In addition, the beach city will be asked to pay one-half of the monthly laundry bill.
