The Los Angeles City Schools classroom building program-already the nation's largestreached a new record high during the 1957-58 school year which ended Monday, the City Board of Education was told at its annual meeting.

A total of \$60,128,000 was expended for new construction since July 1 of last year, the Board was informed by Associate Superintendent Virgil Volla, head of the system's building program.

The new record to al includes \$4,736,760 for purchas of new land, \$49,013,557 for h w construction and equipment, \$2,734,-977 for alterations and improve ments, and \$3,642,706 for improvement of grounds.




