Areas Now Open

Thirteen school areas official ly opened for the first time this week. This brings to a total of 23 the recreational facilities now open to the people of Torrance. Available to the public are: 13 school playgrounds, six parks, a pitch and put golf course, a municipal plunge, an adult recreation center, and a craft center. All of the playgrounds will carry on a wide variety of activities for the remainder of the summer. A typical weekly program might include: games, relays, sports, a cookout, a movie, a special event, crafts and art. The time schedules of these activities will be made available at each playground. Any major changes in the activities and schedules will be published in the local papers.

In contrast with the park areas which open at 9 a.m., school playgrounds programs begin at 1 p.m. and end at 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. The schools will operate on a half day schedule from Monday, June 30, to Friday, August 1. Beginning Monday, August 4, the pro-
