The Rabbi served as spiritual leader of a large congregation until 1944 at which time he was seized by Nazi S.S. troops and deported to the death camp at Auswitz. During the next months he was transferred from one death camp to another never knowing which stop would be

About this time the war with Germany was growing to a close and finally came liberation at the hands of the American Third Army. Returning home to Hungary the Rabbi found that his entire family had been murdered by the Nazis.

Beginning life anew the Rabbi served another congregation and was then appointed Chief Rabbi of Western Hungary by the Government.
