Engagement Is Announced

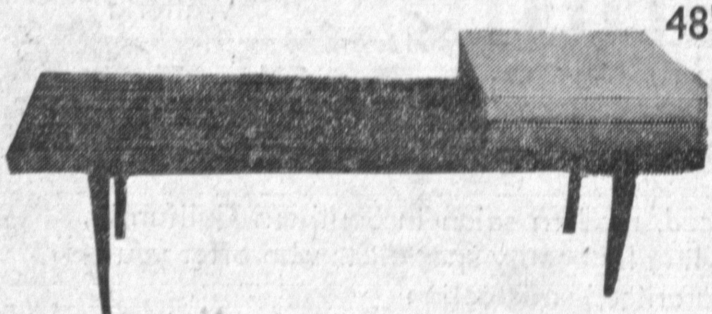

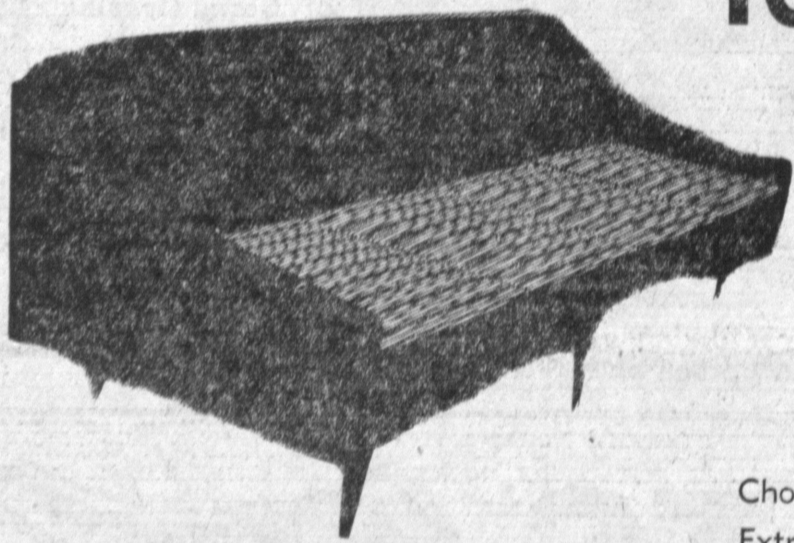
