Discuss Authority in CS Churches

"Lead me in thy truth, and teach me: for thou art the God of my salvation; on thee do I wait all the day." This verse from Psalms (25:5) is the Golden Text of the lesson-sermon on "Truth" in all Christian Science churches Sunday.

In the Scriptural account related by Matthew (8:8, 13) the centurion recognized the power of the Word to destroy sickness when he asked Jesus to heal his servant saying, "Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldst come under my roof; but speak the word only, and my servant shall be healed." And Jesus said unto the centurion, Go thy way; and as thou hast believed, so be it done unto thee. And his servant was healed in the self-same hour.

A passage from "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy declares, "It is not wise to take a halting and half-way position or to expect to work equally with Spirit and matter, Truth and error. 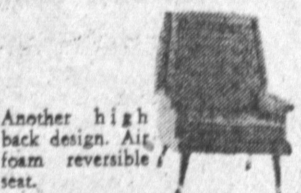

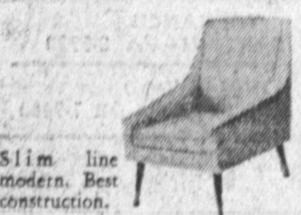
High back slim line design



Another high back design. Air foam reversible seat.

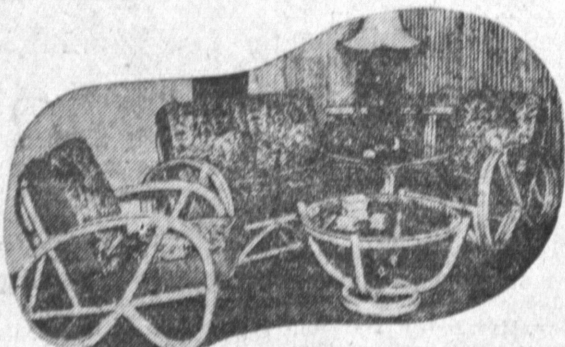

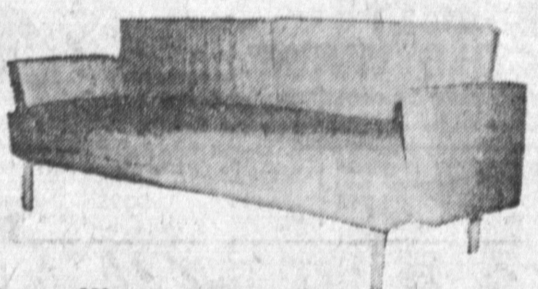
