Biggest Trial Set For City

Probably the largest trial in the city's history will take place in Torrance Municipal Court Aug. 13, when 31 defendants will be tried for causing a riot in Hermosa Beach last weekend.

All the defendents, composed "outlaw" motorcyclists and beach dwellers, have demanded jury trials.

Court attaches are busy scrambling around to find sufficient chairs and benches to provide seating for the 31 men and women and a battery of attorneys.

The trial was transferred to Judge Donald Armstrong's Torrance court because there are insufficient facilities in the South Bay Municipal court-
