Raise Fees for Handbill Throwers

It will cost \$50 per day for handbills to be distributed under a revision approved by the City Council Tuesday.

Mayor Albert Isen termed the \$5 per person fee as "a big mistake" and claimed that it will become an invitation to more and more leaflet distribution.

"A \$50 fee will discourage a lot of these people," Isen said. Torrance merchants, who pay business licenses to the city, will be exempted from paying any license fee, the council ruled.

The new law also makes it illegal for more than one copy of the handbills and other advertising matters to be distributed to each home.

Locations of Class Need Told

Locations of an additional 300 elementary classrooms to be financed with a \$15,000,000 bond issue on Oct. 14, were announced by Torrance Unified School District officials this week.

They based their estimates on projected enrollment by 1964.

In addition to 300 elementary classrooms, they announced that additions must be rushed at North and South High Schools to accommodate 3000 students each by 1963. The first unit of West High School must be ready by September, 1962.

New Schools

School officials said that at least four new elementary schools must be constructed. They break down the classrooms used for elementary schools as follows:

Locations

1. North of 190th St., 51 classrooms consisting of a new elementary school on the Madison site and additions to eight existing schools.
2. Southwest Tract, 31 classrooms, including one new elementary school on the Franklin site and additions to two existing schools.
3. Southwest Tract, 26 classrooms consisting of additions to three existing schools.
4. South Arlington, seven classrooms on an existing site.
5. Riviera, 22 classrooms added to existing sites.
6. South Crenshaw, 15 classrooms added to existing sites.
7. Seaside, 27 classrooms added to existing schools.
8. Central Torrance, three classrooms added to existing schools and rehabilitation of Fern Ave. School.
9. Special Education, 14 classrooms consisting of additions to existing schools.

Mosquito District Sought

Petitions to form a Mosquito Abatement District, are now being circulated under sponsorship of the Del Amo Civic Improvement Association.

Its leaders want to annex the area bounded by Del Amo Blvd., Normandie Ave., Vermont Ave., and 212th St. to the Compton Mosquito Abatement District, according to Mrs. Colleen E. Pruvost, secretary treasurer.

A meeting at which plans for the district will be discussed is set for Aug. 5 at 8 p.m. in the Calvary Community Church 1117 Milton St., Torrance.

Mrs. Pruvost said that cost of joining the district will be about 60 cents per year to the average home owner.

"This insurance will cost the average tax payer less than a can of bug spray a year," Mrs. Pruvost pointed out.

She said that the purpose of the district is to stamp out mosquito breeding places in swamps and drains. Residents may also call an abatement crew if they find breeding places.

To join the existing district, will require 10 per cent of the signatures of registered voters.

The registration law was requested by the police department while a petition from residents sought the pool ordinance.

Chamber Clears \$2000 fro City Ranchero Days

Approximately three-fourths of the cost of a float for the Tournament of Roses Parade was raised by Torrance Ranchero Days, Dick Fitzgerald, Chamber of Commerce secretary-manager, announced.

He said that the sponsoring Chamber received at least \$2000 and will possibly make \$3000 from the five-day event. This amount does not include the revenue received by a score of civic organizations which participated in the celebration last week.

Street Plan OK'd

A grade and street plan for the development of an industrial tract bounded by Maple ave., Maricopa st. and the Santa Fe right-of-way, was approved by the City Council Tuesday.

The plan provides for a 50-foot buffer strip north of Maricopa. The Magnavox Corp. plans to build an electronics division on a 10-acre site north of the buffer.

Author Strips Mystery Off Channel Islands in Book

Although located only a few miles from one of the most populated areas in the world, relatively little is known about the Channel Islands.

Discovered 50 years after Columbus first saw the New World, and believed to be the burial place of Juan Rodriguez Cabrillo, who first set eyes on them, the eight islands are shrouded in mystery except for Catalina.

Charles Hillinger, 32, a former Torrance resident, has done something about the islands' anonymity in a book, "The California Islands," which has just been published.

Recreation Area

The illustrated book tells about the history and geography of the island group, and foresees their eventual role as a recreation area for Southern California.

Hillinger, a resident of 1218 S. Helberta ave., Redondo Beach, is one of the few persons who has set foot on all eight islands which lie off-shore Los Angeles, Ventura and Santa Barbara Counties.

Cabrillo, who discovered California and the Channel Islands, is believed to be buried on San Miguel Island, 50 miles west of Torrance, although his grave has never been found. The great navigator died within a few months after discovering California in 1542.

Military Use

Five of the islands are used by the government for military purposes and are barred to visitors. Three others are privately owned.

One of these, Catalina, has become famous as a world-renowned vacation spot, while the other two are used for cattle raising and visitors are not welcomed by the owners.

Hillinger has advocated that the Channel Islands be renamed in honor of Cabrillo.

"There isn't a town or community named after the discoverer of California. He should be honored as much as Columbus," the author maintains.

On Hillinger's prompting, four bills have been introduced in Congress to name the islands after Cabrillo.

Plan Reception for Pat Brown

A formal reception for Attorney General Edmund G. (Pat) Brown will be held in conjunction with a Luncheon at the Ploynesian Restaurant on Aug. 30.

Mayor Albert Isen will serve as chairman of the affair which will mark the only appearance of the gubernatorial candidate in Torrance. Others assisting in the program which will be held from 6 to 10 p.m. will be Councilman J. A. Beasley and Alexander Pope, Brown's chairman in the 17th Congressional district.

Brown's visit here is expected to mark one of the high points in his campaign in this area.

The committee will include representatives of the 67th, 68th and 46th assembly districts.

Stewart to Be at Army Seminar
