Mayor Albert Ison of Torrance, general chairman of the program to be presented at the Polynesian restaurant, will be assisted on the welcoming committee by Mayor Adams Bolton of Gardena, Mayor LeRoy Center of Redondo Beach and Mayor Edward Edwards of Hermosa Beach. Robert Jahn, J. A. Beasley and Victor Benstead, Torrance councilmen; Derk McCarty, Hermosa Beach councilman; George Gordon, El Segundo councilman; and Mary Rohr, Hermosa Beach city treasurer are the other committee members.

Advance requests for reservations indicate a capacity crowd of 1200. Two orchestras, Tahitian entertainers and an unusual dinner taken from a menu of the South Sea Islands will be featured during the evening's program.
