**Evening High School
Classes Open Sept. 15**

Free classes for adults 18 years of age or older will start the week of September 15 announced Victor Kilburn, principal of the Torrance Evening High School. Enrollment will take place with the teachers in the classrooms at the time and day for which classes are scheduled. A 50-cent fee for the entire school year is payable upon registering.

Day and evening classes for adults offered by Torrance Unified School District include academic requirements for a high school diploma, business training, home economics, arts, crafts, shop classes, and classes in English for the foreign born.

The Torrance Board of Education has authorized the use of General Education Development tests (G.E.D.) for veterans and non-veterans as partial requirement for earning a high school diploma.

Last year approximately 3100 adults attended one or more classes. Over 400 enrolled in classes leading toward a high school diploma of which 133 were graduated in June.

Students wishing high school credit, who have not previously completed registration forms, should contact the Adult Education Office, at Torrance High School, prior to enrolling in classes. This office will be open from 9 to 4:30 during the first two weeks of September for those registering for credit or who have questions concerning their programs. Students who do not desire high school credit, or who have been registered previously need not register in advance, but should report to classes for enrollment.

Project will provide increased flood control and protection to the cities of Gardena and Torrance, and the Centinela Valley. It is the second unit in a series of improvements planned to widen and improve the channel from Vermont avenue up stream to 120th street at Crenshaw boulevard.

Construction plans call for the building of a reinforced concrete channel, with a width of 75 feet and a depth of 18 feet which will greatly increase the capacity of the stream to carry off storm waters.

Bridges over the channel at Western avenue and Gramercy will be completely rebuilt to conform with the channel's increased capacity.

Supervisor Hahn pointed out that the small culvert under the existing bridges have been inadequate to carry off storm water, and that debris jams against them, causing the water to back up.

A bridge across the channel on Artesia boulevard is now being built by the State Highway Department and is about half completed.

**Employment Rise
in Plants Cited**

Factory employment in the Los Angeles-Long Beach Metropolitan Area rose for the second month following nearly a year's downturn, Edward P. Park, California Director of Industrial Relations, announced today.

Area manufacturers employed 693,600 wage and salary workers in July 1958, an increase of 2,600 from June. Seasonal expansion in the apparel, food products, and leather goods industries along with continued gains in electrical equipment were mainly responsible for the increase.

Despite these gains, Los Angeles manufacturing employment in July was down by 70,200 workers, or 9 per cent, from July 1957.

Almost all of this reduction occurred in industries producing durable goods. All hard goods lines, except ordinance and ship repair, reported employment cut-backs from last year. July employment in durable goods industries at 498,400 was down by 64,800, or 12 per cent, from a year earlier.

Plans for Recreation Hall Okd

Preliminary plans for a recreation-activity building to be located in the northwest part of Alondra park have been approved by the Board of Supervisors and the architects have been instructed to prepare the working drawings. Supervisor Kenneth Hahn announced this week.

Construction of the recreation building will mark the second phase of the development and improvement of this section of the park, which was formerly occupied by a veterans housing unit which had served its purpose.

The 13 acre site had never been improved for public use and enjoyment as a park until last year when Supervisor Hahn was able to have the area landscaped and have three baseball diamonds built.

Plans for the recreation-activity building call for a structure of nearly 5,000 square feet to include a large activity room, multi-craft and meeting rooms, a kitchen, offices, rest rooms and storage. A large paved patio will extend around all sides of the building.

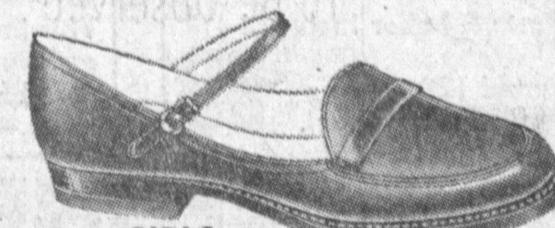

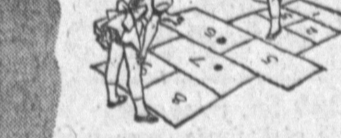
