**Registrar Sees Lag in Number of Signed Voters**

Los Angeles County alone, among the half-dozen counties in the state with the largest populations, has fewer registered voters this year than in 1956, even though its population has increased by more than 400,000 during the past two years, according to estimates by the Regional Planning Commission. Benjamin S. Hite, Registrar of Voters, reminds all persons not now registered, who plan to vote in the November general election, that the deadline is September 11. Anyone not registered by that date will not be allowed to vote.

Hite points out that at every election many persons find themselves ineligible to vote because they have unwittingly allowed their registrations to lapse. He lists two major reasons why a person's previous registration may no longer be in effect: 1. By failing to vote in at least one of the two elections, primary or general, in 1956. 2. By moving out of the precinct in which the voter was formerly registered. You may register with any one of the more than three thousand deputy registrars now operating in all neighborhoods throughout the county. These deputies can be found at all city halls, at many banks, large department stores, drug stores, supermarkets, and other business establishments.
