

Charges Fly on City Lease

Charges that a restaurateur is trying to "chisel" on his rent were hurled Tuesday, when the City Council unanimously decided to hold Sidney Hodemaker, president of Hody's restaurant chain to his original contract with the city.

"First we gave him an extension, now he wants to chisel on his rent," snapped Mayor Albert

Herbert Albright, Hodemaker's representative, asked the city for relief on rental for the corner of Pacific Coast Highway and Crenshaw blvd. The rent this month went up to \$600 per

Albright asked for a reduction rent until April 1, because the restaurant is not even built.

"There's been one breech of contract after another," declared Councilman George Bradford, referring to alteration of plans, which will make the eatery smaller than had been announced earlier.

The Council finally decided that the city should keep the restaurateur to his lease, and have him come in with alternative suggestions which the city may, or may not, agree to.
