Unitarian Church to Sponsor Program of Negro Folk Music

A colorful background of American Negro Folk Music will unfold Oct. 19 at 8 p.m. when the Pacific Unitarian Church presents the famed composer-conductor, Jester Hairston, with a chorus of 30 voices in an exciting evening of narration and music at the Masonic Temple, Redondo Beach.

The experiences and progress of the negro slave in an alien world, vividly described by Hairston, will be interspersed by some of the songs that relieved the hardships of those early times. These beautiful traditional spirituals and folk songs, arranged by Hall Johnson and Jester Hairston, reflect the pains and sorrows of a people thirsting for freedom, and tell of joyful anticipation for a better life. Jester Hairston draws from his rich background in folk music to reveal their sometimes hidden implications.

Stella Herman of El Camino College, featured soloist of the evening, will present a group of spirituals arranged by the late H. T. Burleigh and Edward Boatner, contemporary composer. Mrs. Herman, whose rich soprano voice is familiar to music-lovers of the South Bay, recently appeared in the El Camino production of Elijah. Incidental solos will be sung by Irene Roberts of Hollywood Riviera and Wm Mewborn of Torrance.

Hairston comes to the South Bay with a variety of experi-

ence in the entertainment field. He is affectionately known for his role of "LeRoy" on the Amos 'n Andy show, and is acclaimed for his success in arranging and conducting background music for such motion pictures as "Duel in the Sun", "Land of the Pharaohs", "Carmen Jones" and the "St. Louis Blues."

The spontaneity and enthusiasm he imparts to professional groups he gives to the Unitarian Church Choir, augmented for this occasion by members of other vocal organizations including Los Concioneros, El Camino College, Palms Verdes Neighborhood Church, and Lutheran Church of the Resurrection Choirs, and Hairston's Los Angeles inter-racial choir.

In sponsoring this "Historical Background of Negro Folk Music" the Pacific Unitarian Church hopes to further an understanding between racial groups and at the same time bring a program of cultural interest and musical worth to the community. Future programs of this nature are planned.

Directors who have conducted preparatory rehearsals for this evening are Lyle Heck, Redondo Beach; Barbara Mabin, Rolling Hills; and Don Bremer, Playa del Rey.
