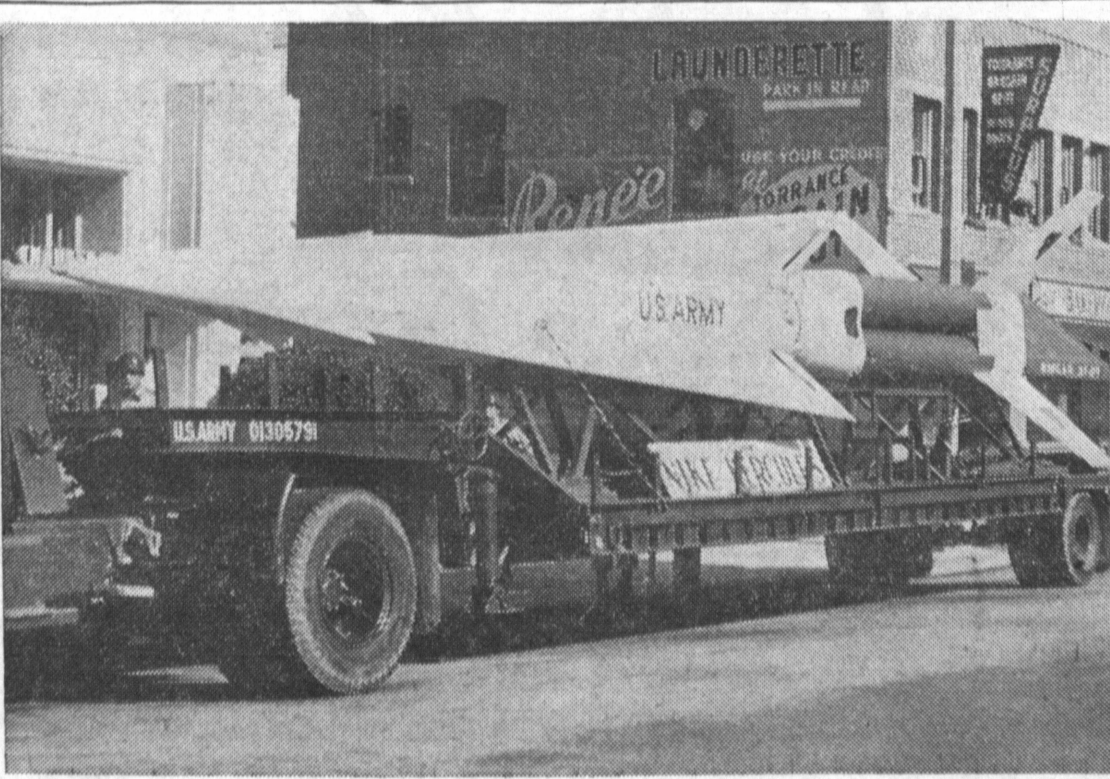

**College Board Lashes out at Proposition 17**

Opposition to Proposition No. 17 on the November ballot was expressed by the Board of Trustees of El Camino College in the form of a resolution made public today.

Board opposition to the measure was based upon the fact that No. 17 would severely reduce State revenues from the sales tax, upon which financing of public schools on the State level is largely dependent.

The Board noted that the measure would increase income tax rates up to 46%.

Foster A. Day, president of the college board said, "Proposition No. 17's serious threat to public education in California is dramatized by a recent Facts Consolidates public opinion poll which showed that in Southern California 54 per cent of the voters would vote yes, only 28 per cent would vote no, and 18 per cent were undecided. This is almost two to one. The State-wide poll was bad, too: 48.7 per cent yes, 32 per cent no, and 19.3 per cent undecided.

"The result of this public opinion poll," the board president noted, "shows the lack of understanding by the public of the severe consequences to public education of the passage of No. 17."

The fourth grader at Meadowpark school, recently appeared on "Lassie" and "The Restless Gun."

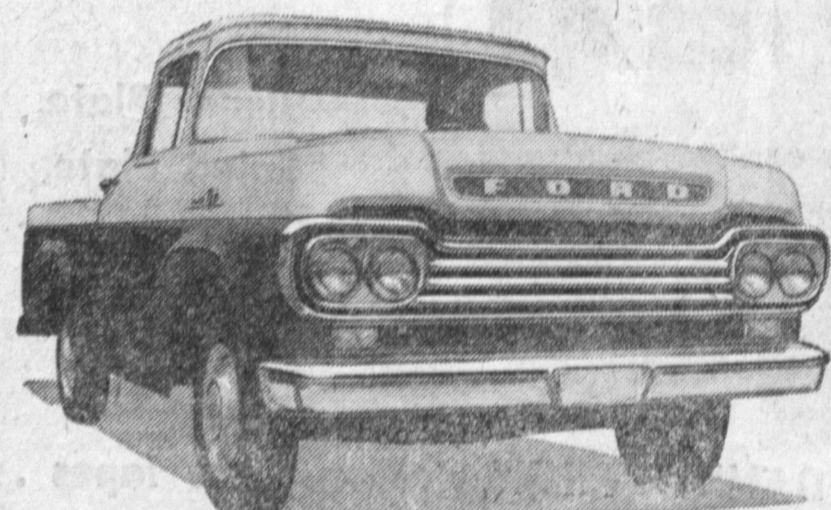
His television career started after he won second place in the All American Boy contest held in the Hollywood Bowl last month.

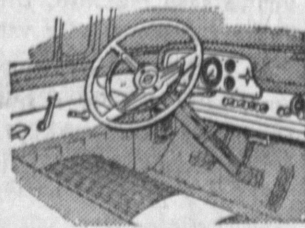
