It will cost between \$24,000 and \$30,000 to stop a slide which is endangering homes on Portobello Drive and Grand Summit

That's what John V. Russell director of public works told the City Council Tuesday followin an invesigation into slippage on the hillside.

Following a warning by City Attorney Stanley Remelmeyer the council decided not to spend municipal funds to correct the erosion, but instructed a city employe to determine if property owners will pay for the drain which will have to be installed.

Although only four lots are presently involved, city officials expressed fear that the condition might spread.




