Navy Officer Plan Deadline

High school seniors and graduates have only until Nov. 15 to apply for the Navy's Reserve Officer Training Corps, F. D. Fields, CS1, Torrance Area Navy Recruiter, said today. Applicants will take the nation-wide compeitive examination on Dec. 13 as the first step toward an appoint-

ment as midshipman. Designed to supplement the officer output of the Naval Academy, the NROTC program makes it possible for a young man to earn a regular commis sion while studying at the civilian college of his choice which has an NROTC unit. All tuition, fees and books are furnished by the Navy, and the student receives an annual retainer of \$600 for four years.

Bank of America was the successful bidder Tuesday for \$1, 800,000 worth of Torrance Uniied School District bonds at a sale of securities before the County Board of Spervisors, it was announced by Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

The Bank offered an interest rate of 3.75 per cent, with payment of a premium of \$34,099 reducing the interest to a net of 3.56 per cent, Chace said.

Funds realized from the sale of the bonds, will be used to complete the third increment at South Torrance High School and the fourth increment at North Torrance High School.
