Torrance Goes to Church' Is Theme for Mnoth Long Program

"Torrance Goes to Church" will be the theme of a month-long program to be sponsored during the month of November by Torrance Ministerial Association. The emphasis will be to acquaint Torrance residents with the city's churches.

The Chamber of Commerce reports a growth of 23,000 persons. In the process of establishing homes and setting up rou-

times of work and family life, many families have yet to become acquainted with the spiritual opportunities which the city's churches make possible. Some have no church home and are uncertain where to go. Others have an emotional tie with their former community.

Prepare Flier
To help the families of Torrance make a selection, a special flier is being prepared by the Ministerial Association, listing the churches and their locations. Near the end of this month, youth of the churches will try to visit each home, to leave a copy. The goal is to encourage each family to find the church of its choice, if it has a preference, or the church of its neighborhood, if they are just getting acquainted.

The challenge is also for the children of Torrance, who make up over 40 per cent of the population. The churches and church school will be looking for "those who enter as strangers, but leave welcomed, to return again."

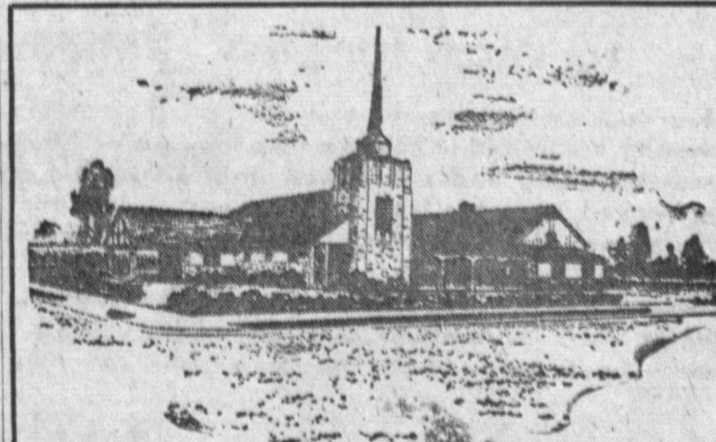

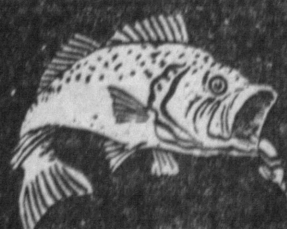
