Break Ground for New Drug, Department Stores

Groundbreaking for a new department store and drug store in the \$500,000 business center adjacent to Shoppers Market at Main and Carson Sts., was held Thursday.

The Stacy Drug Store, to contain 12,000 square feet of floor space, and the Budget Department Store, which will contain 15,000 square feet, will be completed.

Both new stores will be completely self-service. Of the most modern design, the buildings will be completely air conditioned with terrazzo floors.

The drug store will be headed by Marvin Dizak, who as president of Stacy Drug Stores, announced that this will be the first unit of a chain which will compete with other major drug store firms in Southern California.

Dizak is well known in the Torrance area, since he was formerly vice-president general manager of Clark Markets, and is widely recognized as a top food and drug merchandiser.

Stacy completely self-service will have the motto, "the world's friendliest super drugstore," and will feature low prices and the largest 10-cent ice cream cone in the world.

It will also boast one of the largest camera and photo departments in the entire area.

Budget Department Store, headed by Joseph Gach, president, will feature complete self-service, and will operate on a large volume quick turn-over basis, with consistent quality and reasonable prices.

Conant and Lieberman will be contractors for the project designed by Richard N. Jasper. The new stores will connect to each other and Shoppers Market.

Another highlight of the one-stop shopping center will be a sprawling, 1000-car parking lot.

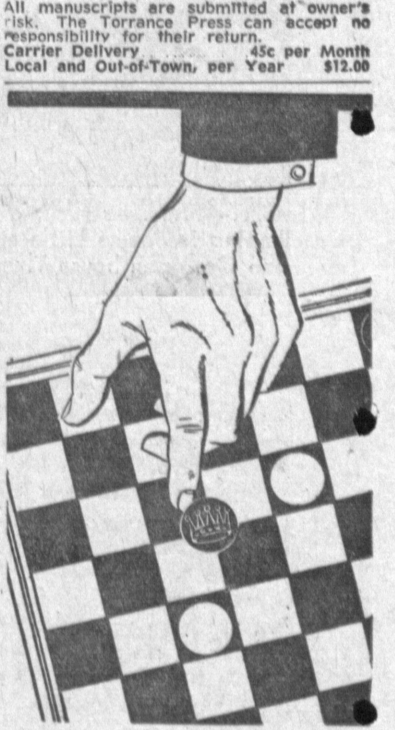
