Water District Planned

A meeting of representatives for a petition drive to form a Central and West Basin Replenishment District was attended by members of the new Water Commission.

The meeting Monday at Lococo's Restaurant, was briefed on the needs to form a district to replace 700,000 acre feet accumulated overdraft on the underground supply caused by population and industrial growth.

Purpose of the district is to provide on underground reserve in the event of disaster such as earthquakes, bombing, or critical radio-active fall-out.
