Young Land Co. was granted approval for 18 homes on three acres north of 228th St., and west of Moneta Ave.

Famed Pianist to Appear at Local Concert

Leonard Pennario, pianist, will be the featured soloist on the next concert of the Joint Youth Band-Artist Concert Series, scheduled for the Torrance High School Auditorium Jan. 8.

This will be the second of a series of concerts being sponsored jointly by the Torrance Area Youth Bands and the Torrance Junior Woman's Club. Tessa Spivakovsky, violinist was the first artist of the series. The Hollywood Saxophone Quartet will appear on the third concert set for Mar. 11, and the final program for May 23 will feature the winners of the music competition scholarships.

This will mark the second appearance of Pennario in Torrance. He has programmed works by Mozart, Franck, Schumann-Liszt, Chopin, Debussy, and Moszkowski. The Youth Band, which performs on the first half of the concert, will feature the Clifton Williams "Symphonic Suite" which won the international band competition award for last year. Soloist for the band part of the program will be Tom Greer, young French horn artist. Tom is the son of Calvin Greer, director of bands at El Camino College.

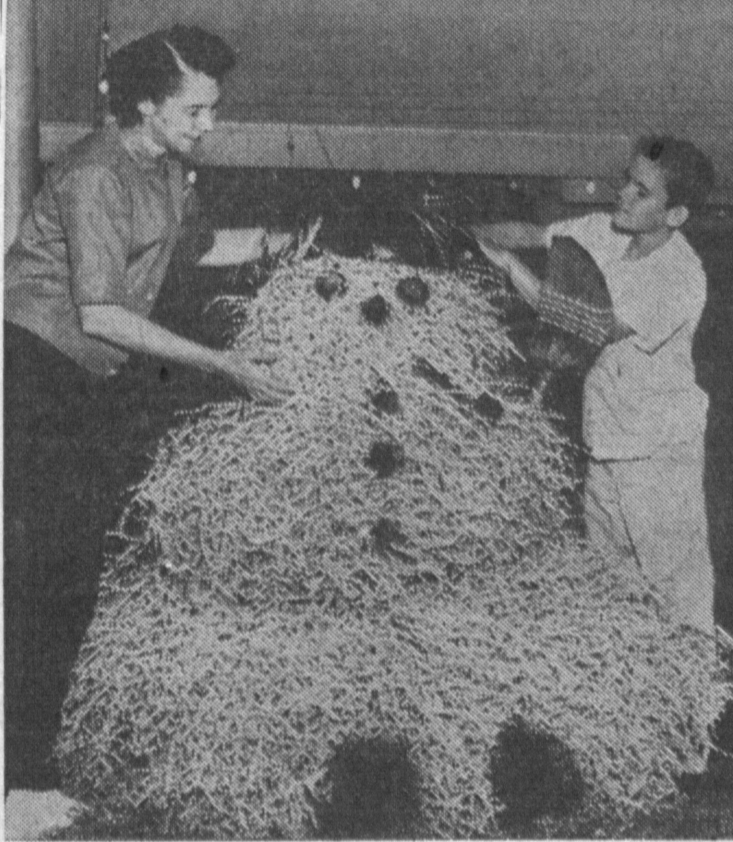
