The Annual Conference of Eleventh District is to be held at Disneyland in April, while the next International Convention is to be held at the Edgewater Beach Hotel in Chicago in July.

Two major projects sponsored by Altrusa International, supported by voluntary contributions from members are Founders Fund Vocational Aid, which enables women to enter the job market, and Grants-in-Aid, that is building friendship with women in Latin America and Asia.

Under the first of these proj ects, gift grants of \$50 to \$250 are made to women of all ages who need training to become self-employed.


