Big Turnout Proves Success of Recent Torrance Polio Clinic at Plunge

"A successful community enterprise," announced Mrs. R. W. Mosher, general chairman of the Torrance Polio Clinic, in reference to the overwhelming turnout on Jan. 20 for shots at Benstead Plunge.

A total of 1456 persons received Salk vaccine. Of these, 725 were adults and 731 children.

As a result, \$446.91 will be donated to the March of Dimes by the four sponsoring chapters of Epsilon Sigma Alpha International Sorority; Delta Gamma, Eta Kappa, Eta Lambda and Eta Mu.

Due to the number of local doctors who volunteered their services, there was very little waiting in line.

Doctors who served at the clinic were Ralph W. McNeill, J. W. Greenhut, Wing Y. Mar, Samuel J. Paltin, William C. Kimpel, Chesley R. Houske, Don Cortum, Fred Chasan, C. R. Barnes and Donald M. 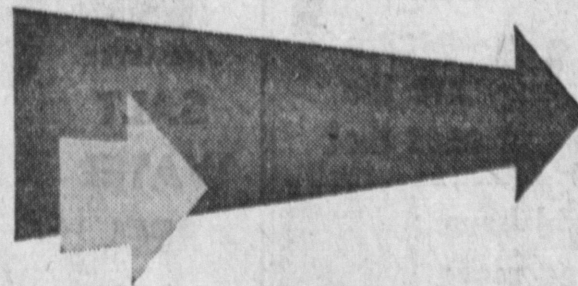
