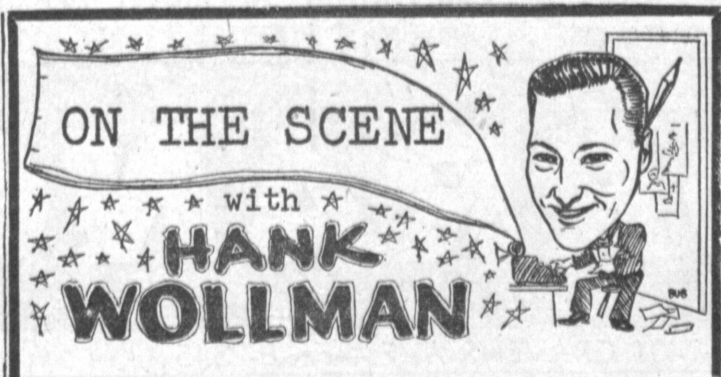

Civic Leaders Attend Formal Opening of New \$600,000 Palos Verdes Bowl

Official dedication ceremonies for the new Palos Verdes Bowl were held Thursday on a 15-acre industrial-commercial tract being developed by Jackblit, Inc., 24600 Crenshaw Blvd. Attending the dedication for the \$600,000 bowling center were local civic and business leaders, including Mayor Al Isen; George Stevens, city manager; George Powell, director of city planning; and R. W. Bishop, city engineer. The ceremonies preceded the grand opening celebration for the public held Saturday, when Buddy Bomar, nationally known bowling star, exhibited his skill.
