**Groundbreaking Rites Set for Harbor Hospital**

Groundbreaking ceremonies for the Bay Harbor Osteopathic Hospital in Harbor City will be conducted Sunday at 2 p.m. City and civic leaders will witness the first shovel of earth being turned at the site of the \$775,226 hospital at Lomita Blvd. and President Ave. Ernest W. Hahn is the general contractor. The hospital will be completed in approximately nine months and will occupy six acres.

**George Shearing Quintet to Headline College Jazz Show**

George Shearing, "A Touch of Genius," and his Quintet will present jazz at El Camino College, February 27 at 8:30 p.m. in the Women's gym. Shearing, Capitol recording artist, will present a two-hour jazz concert. The London-born artist became a naturalized American citizen in 1956. He comes to El Camino following engagements at the Embers in New York, New Frontier in Las Vegas and

the Hollywood Bowl. The artist has just completed four nationwide concert tours with Billy Eckstine and Count Basie, during which they performed in every major auditorium and theatre in every principal city in the US and Canada. Early in his career, the blind pianist was acclaimed as the outstanding foreign-born musician in this country. The demand for personal appearances by this group has swelled to international proportions. Shearing has been named the number one pianist in a dozen nations, including Japan, Australia, Germany, France, and South Africa.

He gained the reputation of being one of the most consistent sellers in the recording industry and the biggest crowd-drawer in the entire jazz realm. Some of his recordings include "I Only Have Eyes For You," "You Are Too Beautiful," "How Come You Do Me Like You Do?," "These Foolish Things," and "Lullaby of Birdland," the latter written by Shearing. The public is invited to attend the jazz concert. Tickets will be on sale in the book store of the Campus Center, \$1.50 for bleacher seats and \$2 for reserved seats.
