The Hollywood Saxophone Quartet, four career musicians of the Hollywood motion picture industry, will be the featured artists on the third concert of the Joint Youth Band-Artist Concert series, March 11. The concert will be held in Torrance Civic Auditorium, corner of El Prado and Cravens.

The Hollywood Saxophone Quartet, organized in 1948, is similar to the famous Selmer Saxophone Quartet of Paris.

The Torrance Area Youth Band will play the first half of the concert, featuring a wood-wind quintet composed of Tom Scanlon, flute; John Mouzakis, oboe; Dick Ducar, clarinet; Tom Greer, french horn, and Terry Hart, bassoon.

The concerts are co-sponsored by the Torrance Area Youth Band and the Torrance Junior Woman's Club as a means of presenting joint concerts by the youth band and internationally famous musicians to the community.
