Meet on Water Planned

A committee of the City Council will meet with the board of directors of the Narbonne Ranch Water Co. No. 3 to determine if negotiations for the acquisition of the private water firm should be conducted.

City Manager George Stevens said he would like the committee to see if the private water company's facilities can be acquired by the city for nothing, or what the cost will be.

The private company serves most of the area of South Torrance which is included in a building hazard zone because of low water pressure.

Councilmen Nicholas O. Drae, Robert Jahn and Victor Benstead will join Stevens in meeting with the board of the mutual water company.

City officials have pointed out that the present lines are located in the rear of the property and should be replaced by pipes serving the front of the lots.

Gun Club Site Deal Shelved

Although the Torrance Rod and Gun Club is willing to pay \$5000 for a piece of property, the city fathers want to get a better deal for the organization.

They tabled for two weeks a request to abandon title to a triangular piece of land at Plaza del Amo and Border Ave. wanted by the club to build a clubhouse.

However, the city received the property under condition that it be used as a park, and if used for other purposes, it reverts to Remco, successor to the Dominguez Land Corp.

Donald Findley, president of Remco, informed the city that it is willing to convey the title for the land at a cost of \$5000.

"I'm all for it, except I can't see paying \$5000 to Remco due to a legal fluke," declared Mayor Albert Isen.

He added that if Remco is paid, he would like the city to get at least some of the money for its recreation fund.
Ernest Malloy, spokesman for the club, said his organization is willing to pay the money for the property.
