school classeas, honors courses, and special advanced classes at El Camino. In many cases, lower classmen are allowed to take more difficult courses usually reserved for juniors and seniors, he said. In

all cases, students are given this more difficult work, if tests indicate that their ability and maturity would allow them to do Parents also are consulted. e said.

Reporting on the work experience program, Hamilton said that the district divides its program into three parts-selling. various other vocational work. and exploratory work in various fields. For working in stores, doctor's offices, recreation aides, and other types of businesses, students may get credit. They receive school training before oing out to do the work.

Both freshmen and seniors tudy various vocations in class, to help them get an idea of their future job preference and to help them take appropriate courses. Upon graduation, the students get aid from the College Entrance Exams and a battery of tests from the State Departnent of Employment.
