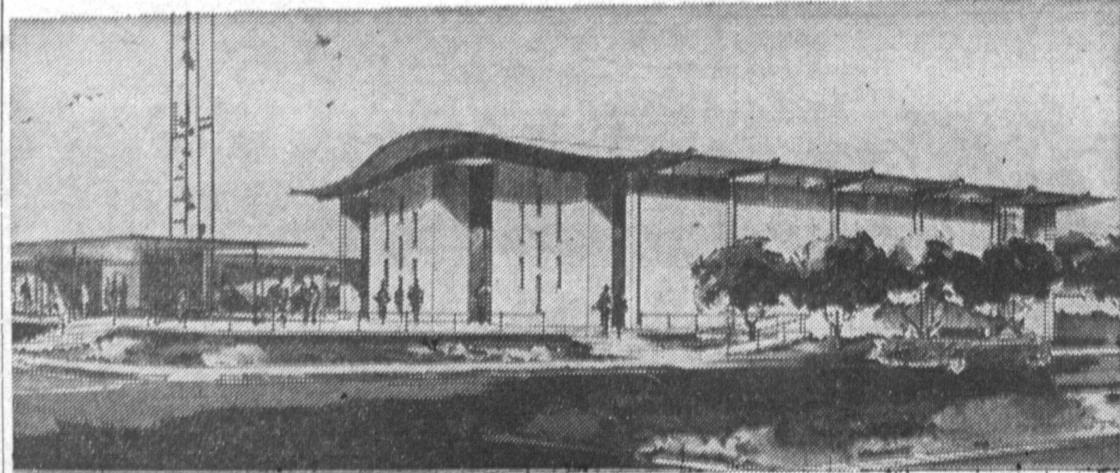


Invitation to Luncheon Given

Plans for New Church of Religious Science Revealed

Construction will start this summer on the new Redondo-Torrance Church of Religious Science, a \$300,000 contemporary, multi-level structure located on an ocean-side strip of Torrance territory at Palos Verdes Boulevard and Calle Miramar. Dr. Earl D. Barnum, minister, announces.

As masterplanned by Risley and Gould, Los Angeles architects, the first phase of building will include a temporary sanitarium, Sunday school, administration offices and a combined waiting room-library. Parking will be provided for 50 automobiles, Dr. Barnum said.

The Risley and Gould master plan calls for construction in the second phase of a permanent sanctuary and floated entrance plaza. The third increment will see the church completed with addition of an elevated level to house permanent administration offices, waiting room-library, nursery, kindergarten, tower, and conversion of the first stage areas into a chapel and social hall.

Howard B. Van Heuklyn, Risley and Gould associate in charge of the church design, speaks of the building's architecture as basically "untraditional." The sanctuary, he says, will seat a congregation of 350, and will be sun-lighted through

high-concealed windows. Its pre-cast decorative block walls, laminated wood beams and solid wood ceiling will follow floating, curved lines, creating an air of tranquility. The float-series of bells and clustered ed plaza, reminiscent of the old

Spanish meeting place, will command a view of the nearby ocean. The starkly modern tower, made of anodized bronze, will feature a series of bells and clustered lights.

Appoint Pearson Circuit Minister
