

(Continued from page 1) your hands. Touch your head. Touch your foot. Shake your foot. Shake your hand. Big. Count: one, two, three, Small!" Response from the children and parents has been quite good, but considerably more study is needed before any such district-wide program would be considered.

Nation-wide, foreign language nstruction in elementary is a relatively new idea. It is estimated that some 300,000 elenentary children in 44 states nad some school instruction in foreign language last year. A few California districts have tried this plan, with Spaniah most commonly taught. At several other Torrance schools, various methods are

under study.

Parkway School, for instance, has three teachers who give their children some Spanish in addition to regular reading, writing, arithmetic and other subjects. Keith Deeds, John Lankford and Dan Alvich, all of whom have good Spanish backgrounds, use mimeographed instruction sheets to help their children "habla Espanol." Several other teachers also have teachers who offer Spanish French or German in class.

At several schools, extra-curricular clubs are offered for students who are interested and enrollment has been good. For instance, Riviera School has four separate language clubs a Latin Club led by Mrs. Elizabeth Aubrey; a Spanish Club under Miss Susan Waters; a 🗣 French Club taught by Robert Simon; and a German Club sponsored by Mrs. Kay Loftus. The German Club frequently also uses the help of a former


