Beauty Workshop Offered at Broadway

A six lesson Seventeen Magazine Beauty Workshop, open to girls between the ages of 14 and 18, is being held at the Broadway Del Amo. The course is designed to teach local teenagers the beauty techniques of fashion models.

The \$5 fee for the workshop covers lessons in such beauty basics as sleep, exercise and diet; modeling, skin care and makeup with lessons by an expert cosmetologist; hair care and styling; facts, figures and wardrobe coordination; and tips on special teen beauty problems.

Text for the course is a 44 page Seventeen beauty booklet. In addition girls receive a pink and black hatbox in which to carry the materials needed for each lesson, and a diploma when they graduate.

This marks the second time that the Broadway Del Amo is offering the workshop in this area. One of 90 stores from coast to coast offering these unique beauty classes, the Broadway was among 40 charter members that carried the first sessions last fall.

The course is offered to Hi-Deb Club members. The club was started in the Broadway last fall especially for high school girls, and members receive monthly news letter containing news from other schools and activities in the store, like the special Hi-Deb Fashion Shows. Girls may sign up for both the Hi-Deb Club and

Beauty Workshop in the Hi-Deb Department of the Broadway.

Commenting on the success of previous Beauty Workshop classes, Miss Katie Nichols, the store youth coordinator, declared "All young women are eager to learn how to improve themselves. That's why we are delighted to offer this course again—we know we are providing a real community service. During our new session we plan to give students advice on coordinating study and beauty routines, as well as modeling instruction which is used to advantage in our Hi-Deb Fashion Shows."
