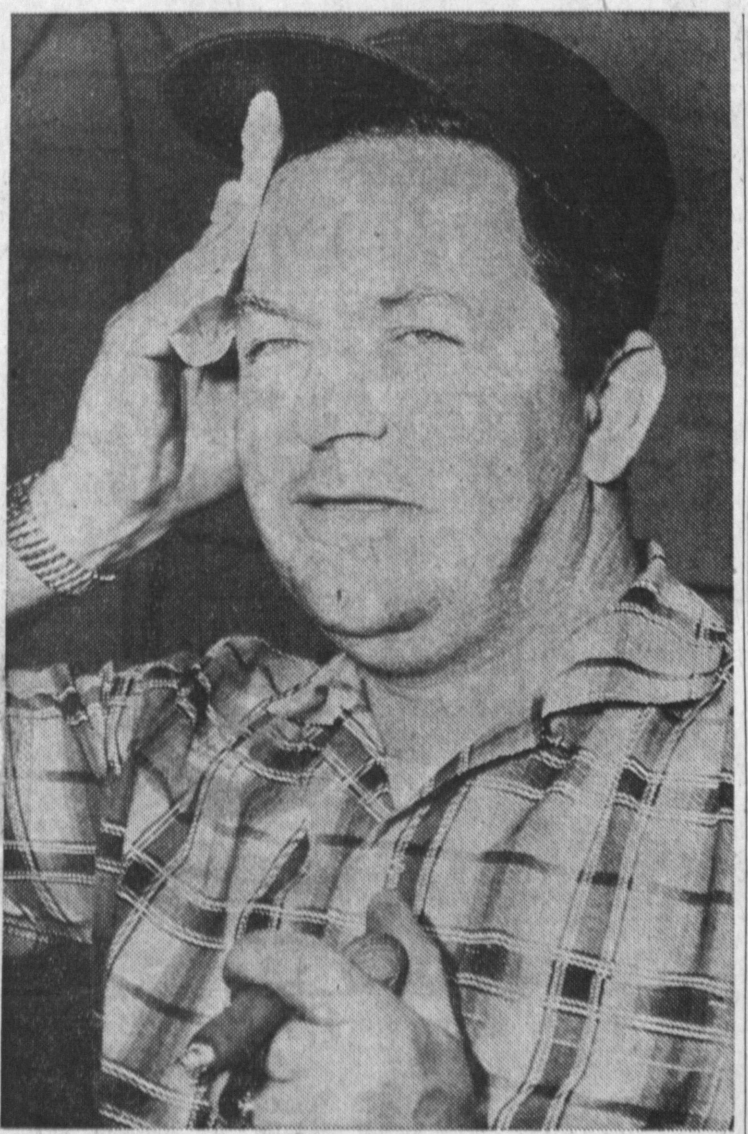

Warriors Scored 1987 Points in Casaba Season

Reviewing a season record of 12 wins and 16 losses, El Camino College basketball coach George Stanich today released 1958-59 team and individual season statistics.

The Warriors scored 1,987 points, while the opponents scored 2,028 points. For El Camino this was a 71 point per game average while for the opponents it was a 72.4.

Percentage-wise, the hard wooders hit on 794 shots from the floor out of 1826 attempted. This is a .435 percentage. In free throw accuracy, the Warrior hoopers hit for a .664 percentage, hitting on 399 shots out of 601 shots taken.

Tom Reddin, All-Metropolitan Conference first stringer, led the basketballers in most of the individual departments. Reddin finished the season with 565 points for a 20.2 per game average. Following him was Bob Combs, a Redondo High graduate, with a 12.5 average and a total of 351 points.

Mike Karavas and Bob Garrett followed in that order. Both are graduates of Redondo High. Karavas scored 326 points for 13 point average, and Garrett scored 285 for a 10.2 average.
