Osteopathic physicians and surgeons will give polio inoculations in their offices for \$3. for

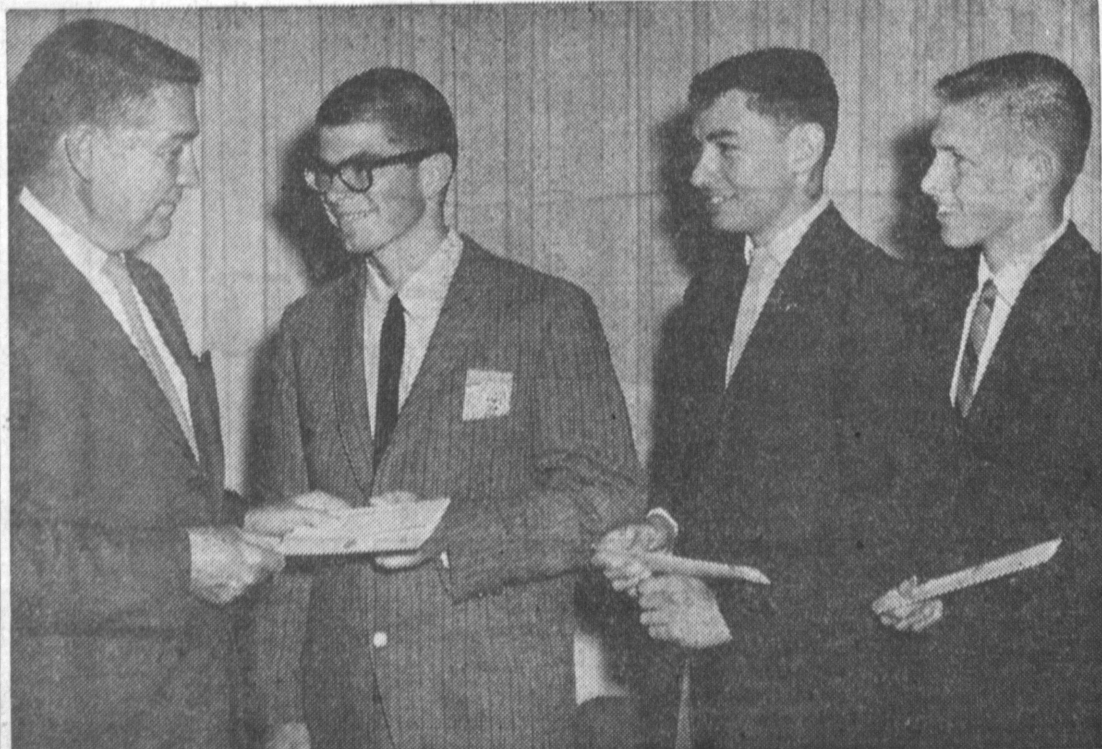
### Saxon Band Honored
