IN THE MATTER OF COUNTY IMPROVEMENT NO. 2034 OF THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF 222ND STREET (A PRIVATE STREET) AND OTHER RIGHTS OF WAY

NOTICE INVITING BIDS Notice is hereby given that the Board of Supervisors hereby invites sealed proposals or bids for the construction of sanitary sewers in County Improvement No. 2034, 222ND STREET (A PRIVATE STREET) and other rights of way in accordance with the terms and provisions of the Resolution of Intention adopted by the Board on the 10th day of March, 1959, and the plans and specifications therefor which are filed in the aforementioned office of said Board.

Said proposals, or bids, will be received by the County Clerk, Ex-Officio Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, at the Public County Room 900, Los Angeles County Engineering Building, 108 West 2nd Street, Los Angeles 12, California, until 9:00 a.m. on Friday the 15th day of May, 1959, and will be opened, examined and declared by the County Engineer at 9:15 a.m. on the same day in the County Engineer Hearing Room, Room 101 in said Los Angeles County Engineering Building.

The proceedings for the aforesaid improvement are under and in accordance with an Act of the Legislature of the State of California known and designated as Division 7 of the Streets and Highways Code (Improvement Act of 1911), and the bonds to be issued to pay the costs and expenses thereof as provided in said Resolution of Intention will also be issued in accordance with the provisions of said Act.

Proposals must be submitted on the blank forms prepared and furnished for the purpose and may be obtained at the Office of the County Engineer, Room 103, of said Los Angeles County Engineering Building. At said office bidders may also obtain copies of the plans, profiles and specifications for the contemplated improvement upon deposit of \$5.00 per set, such deposit will be refunded, if the plans, profiles and specifications so obtained are returned in good condition to said Room 103, Los Angeles County Engineering Building.

Each submitted proposal must be accompanied by a check certified by a responsible bank, or by a bond, payable to the County of Los Angeles in a sum equivalent to at least ten (10) per cent of the total aggregate amount of the bid, as a guarantee that the bidder, if his proposal be accepted, will enter into and execute the awarded contract, and furnish the required bonds in connection therewith, in accordance with the terms of the aforementioned specifications. In the event that a bond is submitted, it shall be signed by the bidder and a duly authorized corporate surety acceptable to the Board of Supervisors.

PREVAILING WAGE SCALE: Pursuant to the provisions of the Labor Code of the State of California, the County Board of Supervisors has ascertained the prevailing rate of per diem wages in dollars, based on a working day of eight hours, for each craft or type of workman or mechanic needed to execute the proposed contract under these specifications; and it will be required that not less than said rates be paid to all such workmen or mechanics employed or engaged upon the work.

Except as otherwise specifically provided for painter classifications, the rates of per diem wages for each of the various classifications of work shall be the hereinafter set forth prevailing rates of hourly wages multiplied by eight. Eight hours shall constitute a day's work; it being understood that in the event that workmen are employed less than eight hours per day, the per diem wages shall be deemed to be that fraction of the per diem wages herein established that the number of hours of employment bears to eight hours.

The contractor shall, as a penalty to the State or political subdivision on whose behalf the contract is made or awarded, forfeit ten dollars for each calendar day, or portion thereof, for each workman paid less than the stipulated prevailing rates for any public work done under the contract by him or by any subcontractor under him, and the body awarding the contract shall cause to be inserted in the contract a stipulation to this effect.

Provided that overtime rates, rate of pay for Saturdays, Sundays and holidays shall apply to those holidays as recognized in the collective bargaining agreements applicable to the particular craft, classification or type of workman employed on the project. Provided that notwithstanding the general provision contained herein, Guards and Watchmen shall be paid one and one-half times the prevailing rate for overtime (overtime shall be time worked in excess of eight hours per day or forty hours per week), and the straight prevailing rate for time worked on Saturdays, Sundays, and where such time does not constitute overtime.

APPRENTICES—May be employed in conformity with Section 1777.5 of the California Labor Code.

RIGGERS—Same wage scale as craft to which rigging is incidental.

WELDERS—Same wage scale as craft to which welding is incidental.

FOREMEN—All foremen herein separately classified shall be paid not less than 25 cents per hour more than the hourly equivalent of the daily rate of the highest classification in which he has supervision in the six Basic Trades.

The necessity for the use of an employee as a Signalman shall be determined by the Contractor. When used, he shall be an Engineer-Officer who assists in giving or relaying signals by mechanical means (also by means of hand signals on excavation work) directly to the Operator of hoisting equipment only.

The rate of compensation for any classification not listed in the schedule, but which may be required to execute the proposed contract, shall be commensurate and in accord with the rates specified for similar and comparable classification or for those performing similar or comparable duties.

The time within which the aforementioned work must be completed by the Contractor undertaking the same has been fixed at thirty (30) calendar days from and after the date of execution of the contract agreement.

The Board of Supervisors reserves the right to reject any or all bids, and to waive technical errors and discrepancies, if to do so seems to best serve the public interest.

By virtue of Los Angeles County Ordinance No. 4348, all collection of assessments within the thirty (30) day period from recordation must be made by the County Engineer and not the Contractor.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS: BIDDERS MUST SATISFY THEMSELVES BY PERSONAL EXAMINATION OF THE LOCATION OF THE PROPOSED WORK AND BY SUCH OTHER MEANS AS THEY MAY PREFER AS TO THE ACTUAL CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS OF THE WORK, AND SHALL NOT AT ANY TIME AFTER SUBMISSION OF THE BID DISPUTE, COMPLAIN OR ASSERT THAT THERE WAS ANY MISUNDERSTANDING IN REGARD TO THE NATURE OR AMOUNT OF WORK TO BE DONE.

QUALIFICATIONS OF BIDDERS: THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES RESERVES THE RIGHT TO REQUIRE ANY BIDDER TO FURNISH SATISFACTORY EVIDENCE OF HIS EXPERIENCE AND ABILITY TO PERFORM THE WORK.

Schools to Get Federal Funds for Counseling: Torrance schools will get \$2600 in federal funds for use in the counseling and guidance programs at the three local high schools, the Board of Education was informed this week.

The money represented about half of what the district had sought under terms of a bill which provides additional money to districts which want to improve their counseling programs.

The money will be used to provide aptitude tests to 10th and 11th graders at local high schools and to hire an expert to evaluate the local guidance programs.

County Late in Delivering Tax: Torrance will lose some money from a delay in receiving property taxes collected by the county, Jerome I. Scharfman, director of finance, announced.

He said the city should have received approximately \$500,000 by April 10, but the funds will not be received until late next month because of a conversion to automatic machinery by the county.

Scharfman said the city usually invests the cash in short term notes, and will lose some interest the money might have earned.

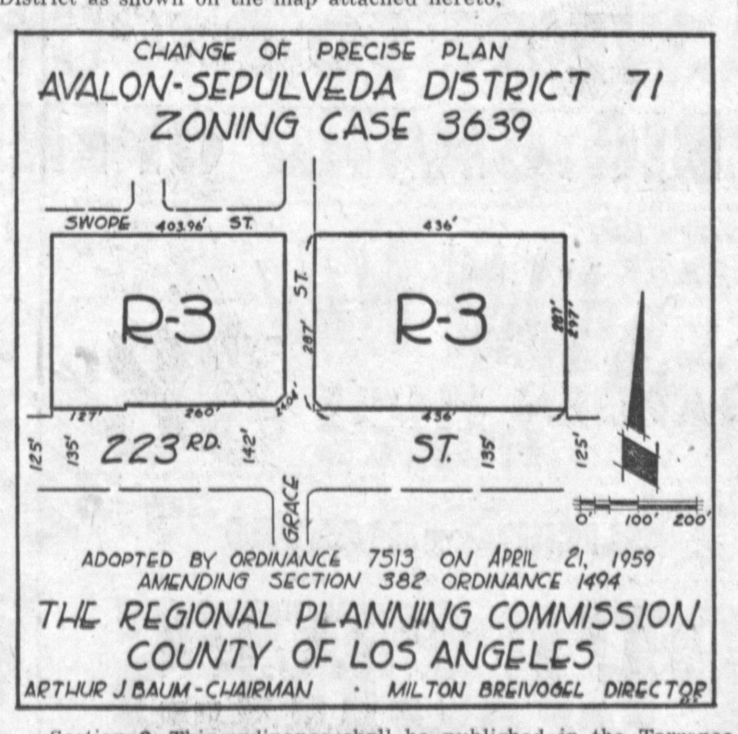

ZONING CASE NO. 3639 ORDINANCE NO. 7513

An ordinance amending Section 382 of Ordinance No. 1494, changing regulations for the execution of the Master Plan of Land Use, relating to Avalon-Sepulveda District No. 71.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles do ordain as follows: Section 1. Section 382 of Ordinance No. 1494 entitled "An ordinance providing for the creation in the unincorporated area of the County of Los Angeles of zones and prescribing area requirements and classes of uses of buildings, structures, improvements and premises in said several zones," adopted September 12, 1927, is amended by amending the map of the Avalon-Sepulveda District as shown on the map attached hereto.
