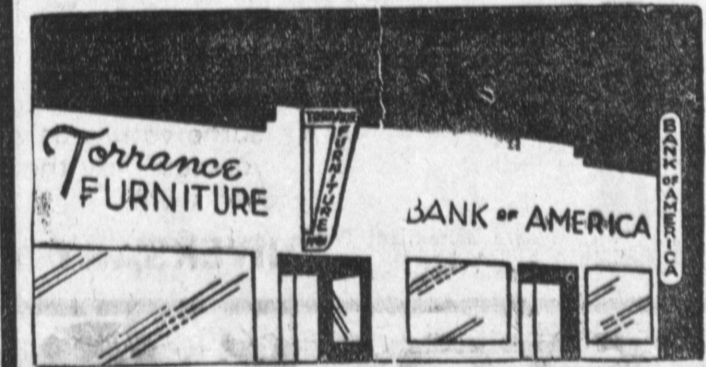

Monterey Hearing Sought

Request that the City Council hold a final hearing which would affirm a 100-foot buffer strip on the south side of Monterey St. was made Tuesday.

Members of the Monterey Residents Committee said that the Planning Commission held two hearings, after which they approved an offer by the land owners to set the wide strip between residences to the north and proposed manufacturing firms on the south.

Meanwhile, Walter G. Mitchell, representative of the R. C. Mahon steel fabricating plant, which intends to build on the site, repeated that their office building must be constructed 50 feet from

Bill to Protect Consumers from Loan Sharks OK'd

A bill to protect the consumer from excessive interest charges and other abuses in installment credit selling, sponsored by Assemblyman Vincent Thomas, has been signed into law by Governor Brown.

The bill, which Thomas called "the most important piece of economic legislation considered by the State Legislature in years, probably since the depression," was aimed at installment selling racketeer's uncovered by an interim committee study last year.

"It is a clear warning to those who would prey on the buying public in any way that their despicable practices will not be tolerated," Assemblyman Thomas said. "It assures the people of the 68th District that they will be

protected.

"Furthermore, at the same time it guards the consumer, the law by setting up safeguards protects the reputable businessman who never has been a party to the questionable procedures brought to light by the interim study.

SCHOOL WORKERS MEET

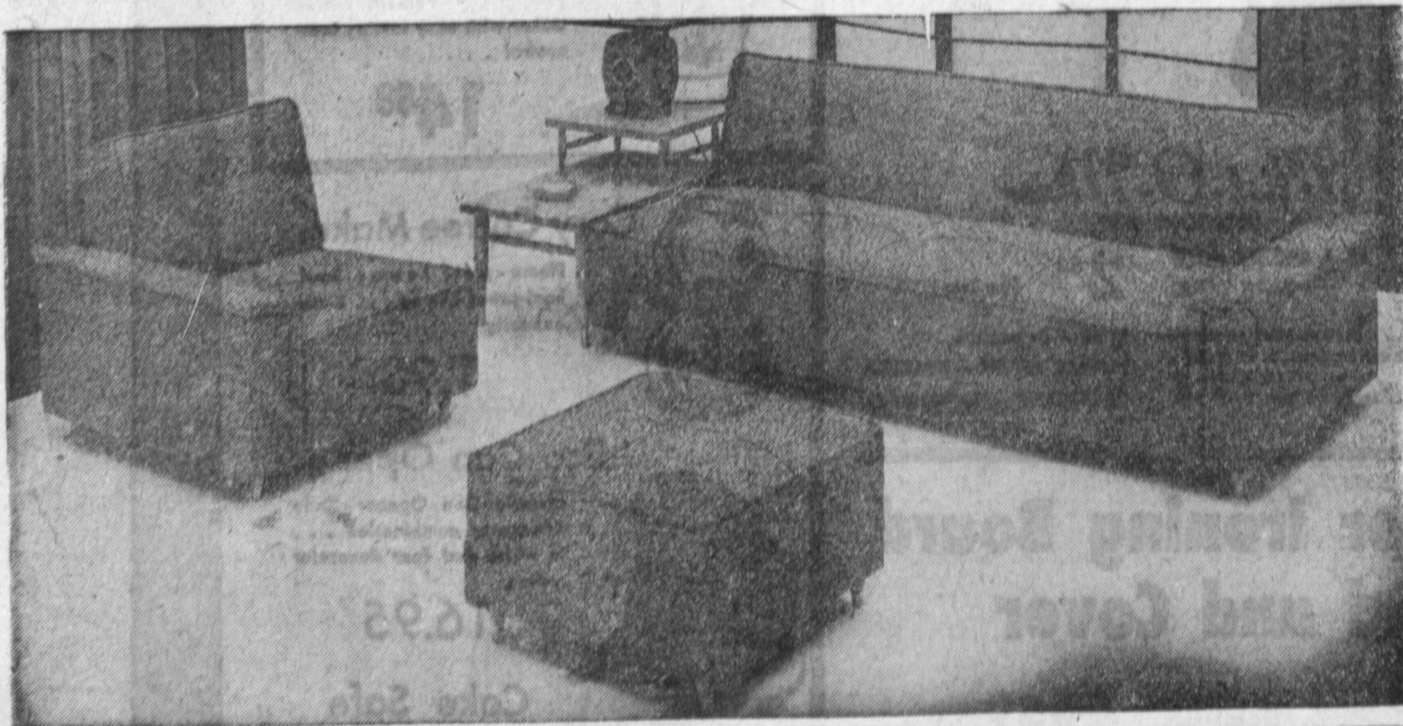

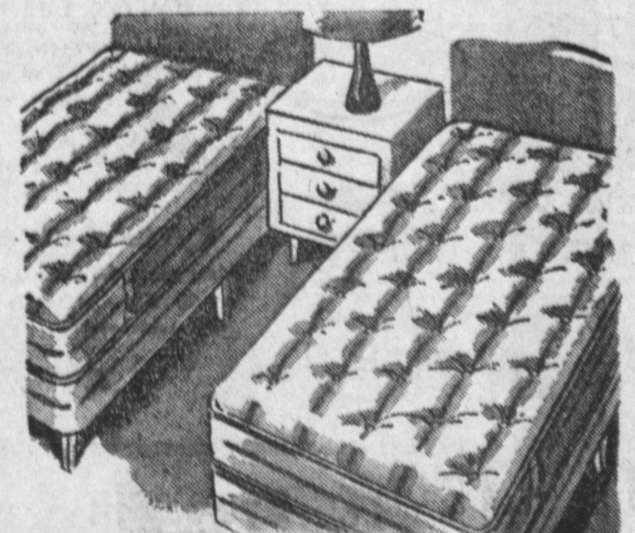

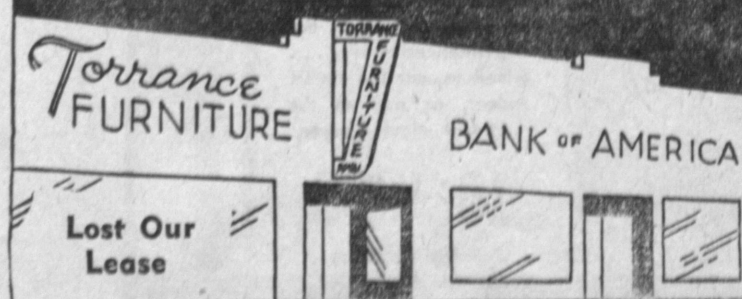
